

FFD OSOM OSCE Sample Question (100 marks)



The above patient has had recurrent oral ulceration for the last ten years. Each ulcer lasts four to six weeks and she usually gets one ulcer at a time. Clinically there is evidence of scarring of the oral mucosa.

1. What is the most likely diagnosis? (20 marks)
2. Following diagnosis, what is the most appropriate topical treatment for this condition? (20 marks)
3. Name SIX contributing factors in this case (30 marks)
4. If this patient also has blurred vision, pain in the eye and vulval ulceration, what diagnosis would then be the most likely diagnosis? (20 marks)
5. What skin lesion might be found in this condition? (10marks)
